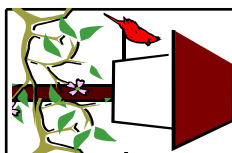

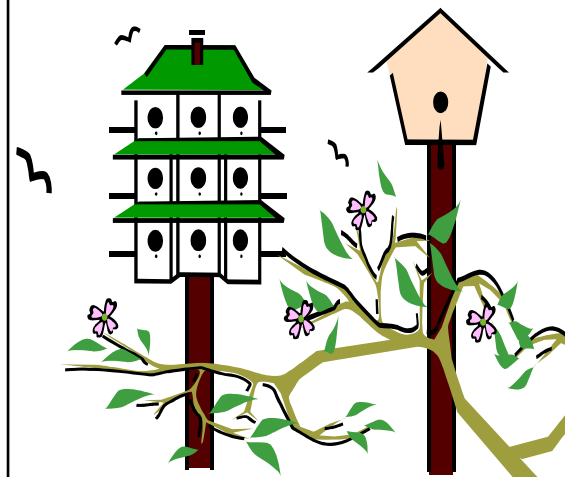

**RC 56531 *Horse-
shoes, Cowsocks,
and Duckfeet:
More Commentary
by NPR's Cowboy***

***Poet and Former Large Animal Veteri-
narian.***

by Baxter Black. A collection of "mostly humorous, occasionally political, and accidentally informative" musings by a popular National Public Radio commentator. He remarks on everything from cowboy vocabulary and the love of a good cattle dog to Afghanistan and the war on terrorism. 2002.

RC 56669 *My Staggerford Journal* by Jon Hassler. Journal kept by the author while writing *Staggerford* (RC 56651), his 1977 novel of small-town life in America. Hassler gives insight into the creative process, plot development, and the evolution of his characters. 1999.

**RC 57178 *Reflections: Life after the
White House*** by Barbara Bush. In this sequel to *Barbara Bush: A Memoir* (RC 38873), she chronicles the eight years

between the presidencies of her husband and son. She recalls official functions, charities and hobbies, extensive travel, world VIPs, and life with her five children and fourteen grandchildren. Bestseller 2003.

RC 58101 *My Life: Abridged Edition* by Bill Clinton. Abridged autobiography of William Jefferson Clinton, 42nd American president. 2004.

**RC 57061 *The Pursuit: The English
Garden, Book 4*** by Lori Wick. 1813. Edward Steele's voyage home to Collingbourne from Africa is delayed when he comes to the aid of two fellow passengers. Edward soon discovers one is a woman on the run to protect her children. Sequel to *The Visitor* (RC 57052). 2003.

The talk of the town and shame of her family, she cannot marry the outlaw father of her child. Instead she marries admirer Sheriff Jesse Harden, and her secrets return to haunt her. 2003.

RC 57984 *Death of a Village* by M.C. Beaton. Scottish constable Hamish Macbeth is avoiding a promotion, investigating local crimes, and arguing with pretty reporter Elspeth Grant as he patrols the seaside village of Stoyre. When it appears that the town is in the grip of a strange religious revival, Macbeth moves there to learn more. 2003
